COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and Musketawa Trail use: It is without a doubt that everyone is affected by the novel coronavirus. Businesses are closed, the school year was cut short and many other changes to our normal life are occurring. We are all pretty-much homebound. Luckily, we are still able to en-

joy the outdoors including our local trails, and this is encouraged. However, we must follow some precautions and rules to do our part and help prevent the spread of the coronavirus. With that in mind please keep the following in mind:

- 1) Follow all rules as posted at trail heads and online at: www.Michigan.gov/Coronavirus
- 2) Practice social distancing. Maintain a 6-foot distance from other trail users.
- 3) Do not congregate. Trail benches and overlooks are off limits while this pandemic is occurring.
- 4) Practice a “carry-in, carry-out” mentality. Garbage containers along the trail will either be closed or removed while the pandemic is occurring.



Also, please be aware that the Michigan DNR has suspended maintenance activities along the trail during this time. Maintenance such as grass mowing, trail clearing, trash removal, etc., is not authorized and will not be performed. As soon as it is again permitted, please know that our trail managers will be back, hard-at-work, keeping the trail ready for you!

2020 TRAIL PROMOTION: Board president Tim Nink and board member James Smith (along with their significant others) attended the 2020 Quiet Adventure Symposium in Lansing at the MSU Pavilion representing the Friends of the Musketawa Trail. Trail Projects 2020: Ravenna Depot

If you have been out and about on the Musketawa Trail last Fall or this year at the Ravenna trail head, you have likely noticed a new addition to the east of the water tower. A replica depot building is taking shape along the trail. The Ravenna Historical Society



in conjunction with the Village of Ravenna and many generous donors (including the Friends of the Musketawa Trail) are responsible for this wonderful project. Current plans include hav-

ing some seating under the entrance awning along with possible “open house” days inside with historical items on display. Currently, there are no plans to have restroom facilities available. We hope you enjoy the new addition to what we feel is the “premier” trail head along the Musketawa Trail.



RAVENNA TRAIL HEAD UPGRADE: The Friends of the Musketawa Trail have plans to add a concrete pad with a handicap access picnic table and bike repair station to the Ravenna trail head location. The pad will be located between the existing picnic tables that we recently upgraded. The repair station will include tools for common bike



repair and a bike pump. We have Michigan DNR approval for this project. We are hoping to get this completed in 2020, pending some project quotes and a release of volunteer/project work following the COVID-19 pandemic. STAY TUNED!

2020 SCHEDULED BOARD MEETINGS**

Oscar Reed, Director on the Board of the Musketawa Trail provided the following information:

West Shore Snowmobile Council is getting another tractor/groomer (new to us) coming down from Drummond Island. Meanwhile, with our new equipment grant from the DNR, we will be purchasing a brand new grooming drag. Both of these two pieces will be used on the Musketawa Trail this coming winter season.

Jill Sell, our Southwest Michigan Trail Specialist, has suspended all trail-related work due to the “STAY HOME, STAY SAFE” executive order by Governor Whitmer. Also, Paul Yauk of the DNR who signs all of our Grants, has put a spending freeze on all of our Special Maintenance trail projects. This suspension was effective March 30, 2020.

Therefore, there will be no maintenance work by George Czinder nor any Port-a-Jons on the Musketawa Trail until the Executive Order is lifted.
