OPENING: We, the Friends of the Musketawa Trail, hope this newsletter reaches out and gives some comfort during the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Outdoor activities and usage of trails continues to be on an elevated trend.

Our Friends board has returned to "in-person" board meetings. This is a welcome change as meetings allow us to gather and talk about the Musketawa Trail in a great setting. Our group is small, but we have a "family" atmosphere in the spirit of giving back to the community in support of the Musketawa Trail

TRAIL PROJECTS (2021 AND BEYOND): After a lengthened delay because of COVID-19 and some cost increases, we have completed the Musketawa Trail upgrade project at the trail head in Ravenna. The project was conceived to replace the exist-

ing wood deck and handicap access table that began to show their age. These items would be replaced by a concrete pad that included a handicap access table, new bollards, and a bike repair station. It was expanded a bit to also include two (2) handicap



parking spaces in front of the area with painting, bumpers, and signage.

The project started with Friends board president ,Tim Nink, his wife, Sheri, and board member, James Smith, removing the old wood decking and table during

an extended Saturday morning. Then we had a contractor come out and pour the new concrete pad inserting the new, steel bollards and steel table center support. Once the concrete was cured, Tim & Sheri Nink

returned to assemble the

handicap access table and do some landscaping. A return trip saw the install of the bike repair station.

A bit later, the Michigan DNR removed the excess soil materials from the concrete pour and painted the handicap parking space and access lines. The final project trip by Tim Nink and James Smith on October 28,

2021, completed the project with the install of the parking bumpers and handicap space

signs.

We hope you enjoy the new upgrades (and the included pictures)! Please provide any feedback you may have on the newly installed bike repair station. We have tentative plans to install these at the trail heads in Conklin, Marne, and Muskegon.




The Ed Holovka memorial is still being planned. As many of you likely know, Ed was the first and longtime Friends of the Musketa-

wa Trail President. The current idea is to have a memorial area near the trail access at the Muskegon/Broadway trail head. After a recent Friends board meeting, the memorial plans have "shifted gears" some. Upon review with the Michigan DNR, it was suggested that we might be able to enhance the memorial if we hold off for short time. As some of you may know, the Michigan DNR has tentative



plans for future re-pavement of the entire Musketawa Trail. Currently, this re-pavement project is still a few years off and without a firm project plan or schedule. However, if we hold off on the memorial, we can likely enhance it, possibly

with a covered shelter, to go along with a planned table and a leads. With current lead bike repair station. Some of you may have heard some sad news with regards to Ottawa County Parks and ultimately the maintenance of the Musketawa Trail. A fire occurred at Grose Park on September 14, 2021, that consumed the maintenance building. This building was a total loss and housed maintenance equipment used to maintain local Ottawa County Parks.



This equipment was also used by Ottawa County Parks to perform mowing and maintenance on the Ottawa County portion of the Musketawa Trail. There was also damage to the bathroom facility. Arson and deliberate damage are suspected by one or more individuals with no suspects or good end of the year.

County for the remainder of the 2021 non-winter season. This arrangement may need to continue into 2022. We want to thank both Ottawa County Parks and the Michigan DNR for their diligence during this tough time performing maintenance work on our beloved Musketawa Trail!

OTHER TRAIL NEWS: The Musketawa Trail will finally get fully connected to the Laketon Trail in Muskegon. The City of Muskegon Public Works Department has plans to get the final connection completed this Fall. The Laketon Trail previously ended at the intersection of Port City Boulevard and Keating. The Musketawa Trail ends at Black Creek Road. A 3/4 mile asphalt connector will be constructed through the Port City Industrial Park from the current end of the Laketon Trail on Port City Boulevard. It will travel south along Port City Boulevard, east on Latimer Drive and south on Black Creek Road. To get space for the separated asphalt trail, Black Creek Road will get a road "diet" (narrowing) to allow the trail to run next to the road.

In the future, there are tentative plans to connect the Laketon Trail to the Muskegon Lakeshore Trail. Currently you can get between the two (2) trails via a street connector route.

These connections are exciting and will allow users to access more areas via a dedicated trail! We hope you enjoy reading this

Our friends at the West Michigan Trails and Greenways Coalition organized this year's West Michigan Trails Challenge as a way to get procrastinators like me out on our local trails. The Challenge featured 40 trails, and participants had to explore as many as possible between June 5 and December 31, 2021.

I took the Challenge and on June 15, I added my first trail, the Fred Meijer Millennium Park Trail. On July 7, I made it up to Hart for the first time in 20 years on the William Field Memorial Hart-Montague Trail. Then, for the first time ever, I rode to Greenville on August 5 via the Fred Meijer Flat River Valley Rail Trail. Once there in Fred Meijer's hometown, I followed the Fred Meijer Flat River Trail on a tour of the city. The high point was the winding descent from the Meijer store to the staging area at the Baldwin Lake Beach.

One way to explore four trails in the Spring Lake area in one ride of 40 miles is to connect the Grand River Explorers Trail, the Spoonville Trail, the Northbank Trail, and the Lakeside Trail. I am always amazed by the hard work and creativity that trail builders and managers use to provide such world class opportunities for trail users.

As of November 1, I have cycled on 22 of the 40 West Michigan trails. This means that I am now eligible for the event medal and tee shirt. With a little luck, I hope to ride one or two more trails before the Even if I somehow manage to ride all 40 West Michigan trails, I still think that my favorite trail will be the Musketawa. I know that because, for me, it is not a trail's beautiful forests, fields, lakes. rivers or trailside towns that I most enjoy. It is all those wonderful memories that I have of building and promoting the Musketawa.
