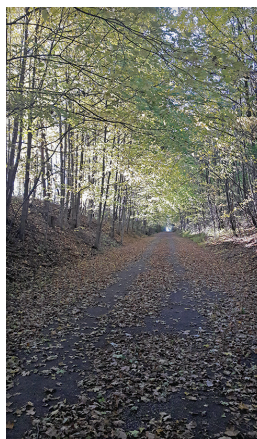


ENJOY



The paved trail features six wildlife observation decks for users to enjoy. Resting benches and informational signage can also be found on the trail. Along with the Ravenna Historical Society, all of these features are courtesy of the non-profit Friends group. The Friends group is funded through generous member donations and the group helps to maintain, upgrade and support the trail via a working relationship with the Michigan DNR and Ottawa County Parks and Recreation.



The Musketawa trail connects eastward with the Fred Meijer Pioneer Trail leading to Grand Rapids. Westward, the trail connects to the Laketon Trail and then on to the beautiful twelve-mile Muskegon Lakeshore Trail.

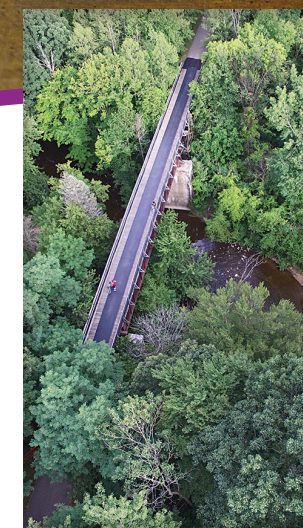

Resting on an old railroad bed between Marne and Muskegon, the Musketawa Trail takes users past scenic orchards, farmlands and wetlands. It travels under peaceful forested canopies and over rambling creeks.

In the middle of the 25-mile trail is Ravenna, the trail's historical centerpiece.

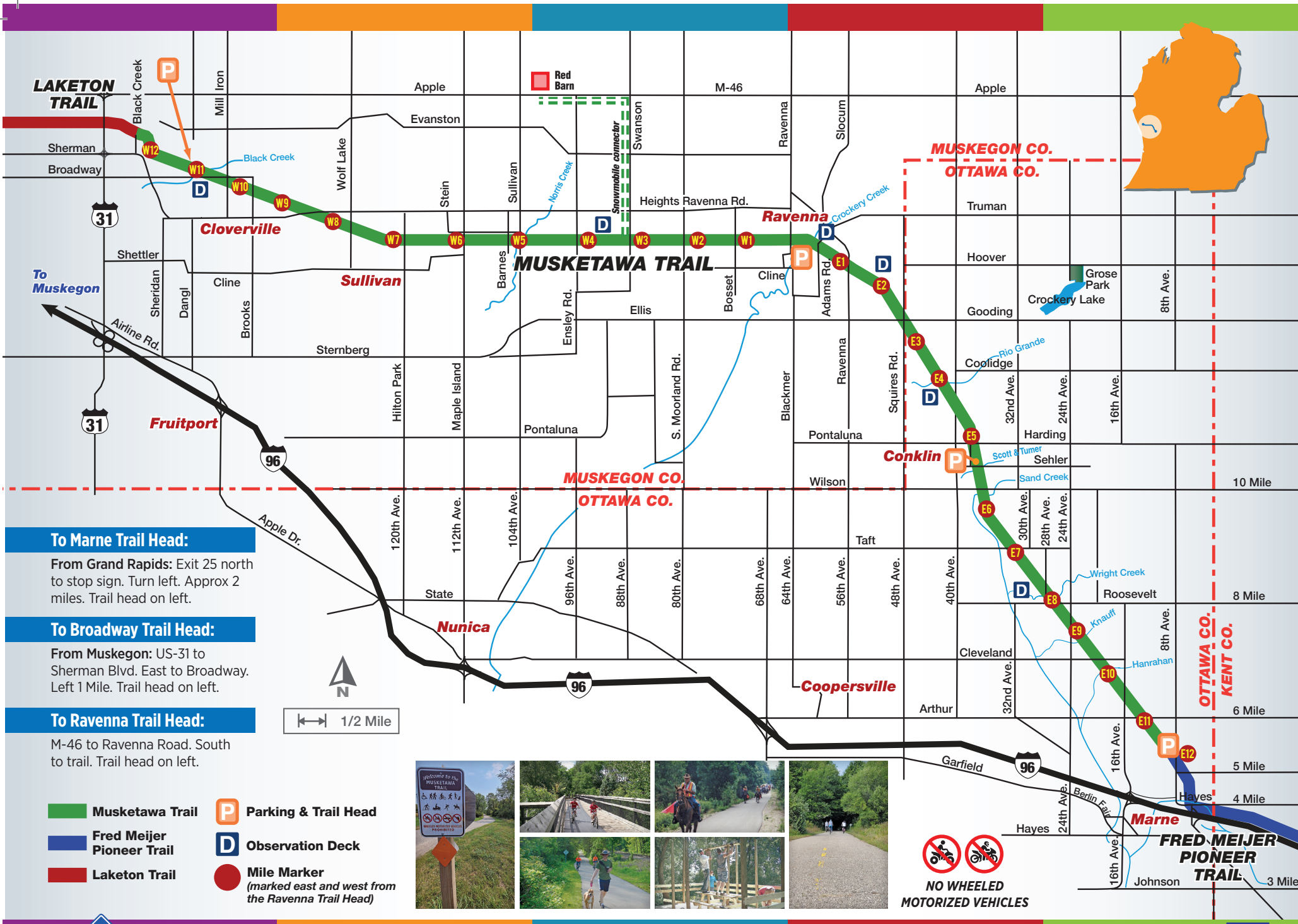
There you will find the longest of 13 railroad trestles (216 feet long) over Crockery Creek. The trail head features a 100-year old rebuilt railroad water tower, railroad signs and signals, and even a red caboose!

To Marne Trail Head:

From Grand Rapids: Exit 25 north to stop sign. Turn left. Approx 2 miles. Trail head on left.

To Broadway Trail Head:

From Muskegon: US-31 to Sherman Blvd. East to Broadway. Left 1 Mile. Trail head on left.

To Ravenna Trail Head:

M-46 to Ravenna Road. South to trail. Trail head on left.
